As the new year begins, and the tax forms begin to arrive we are scheduling your appointment to meet with us to complete your tax return. Your appointment is at **on**. Please bring with you this COMPLETED organizer as well as all the appropriate forms that you normally bring in. As always, appointment times are limited but we will work very hard to find one that works for you. If you cannot make your appointment, you can drop off your information and we will call you with questions if we have any. Due to limited space, we will not be able to reschedule missed appointments.

One new form that you may receive is a 1099K from Facebook Marketplace or E-bay, or cash apps such as Zelle, Venmo, or Cash App. The 1099K makes it looks like you used these apps for business when many of you will have used these to reimburse friends. ALL of these transactions were reported to the IRS. The IRS in late November delayed the requirement for the companies to send these out, however, if you get one it is still necessary for us to reconcile it on your tax return. Remember, even if you didn't get a form from anyone; if you **made money** on a sale or a side job, it is still considered income and still reportable.

New credits for home improvements went into effect this year and can provide you with tremendous tax benefits. If you installed a new furnace, A/C, boiler, heat pump, water heater, woodstove, windows, doors, insulation, or solar battery storage please be sure to provide us with a copy of the PAID invoice. This is now an annual credit up to \$1,200.00 replacing the old \$500.00 lifetime credit. These improvements must be part of your personal residence located in the United States, but it does not have to be your primary residence.

Similarly, if you bought a new electric or hybrid car in 2023, please be sure to bring a copy of that invoice as well.

Also, there are some new opportunities for 529 plans. For example, you may be able to use them to pay tuition for elementary and secondary students or use up to \$10,000.00 to pay off student loans. Ask me if you have any questions about these.

In 2023, meals for business reverted to a 50% deduction. Entertainment expenses are still fully non-deductible.

The 2024 annual gift limit will go up once again from \$17,000.00 to \$18,000.00 per person. This means for example, a married couple can give a total of \$36,000.00 to each person of their choice without triggering a gift tax return.

IRS scrutiny of foreign accounts means you need to be absolutely clear about any non-US accounts or income so that we can report it correctly. If you have either financial interest in or signature authority

over foreign financial accounts that exceed \$10,000.00 at any time during the calendar year, you are required to report this account to the IRS. This does not include foreign stocks held inside your mutual fund accounts.

Once again, the IRS is looking for Crypto-Currency transactions. It has been estimated that as much as 70% of Americans are using or "dabbling" in this currency. Remember, failure to report ANY income is fraud and there is no statute of limitation on fraud. Beginning in 2023, all brokers of virtual currency will be required to provide you with a 1099 for your activity. Please don't be fooled into thinking that there is no historical record of your transactions. If the only thing you have done so far is buy crypto, we will do nothing with that information. However, if you have sold, exchanged, used for purchase, or inherited crypto, those transactions we will need to report.

This year we are encouraging you to go onto the Social Security website <a href="www.ssa.gov">www.ssa.gov</a> and review your statement. I do this annually. It will tell you what your expected benefit amount is as well as let you check to verify that all your past wages have been properly recorded. Go to Prepare, Get a Benefits Estimate. You will have to sign in or create an account.

Like everything else, form prices are going up this year by approximately 10%. They did not go up at all last year even though our prices for supplies, software, and wages increased. While it is a modest increase, I always want to be transparent with my fees. If you have the same return as last year, you will see the increase. If you have more forms, it will be the additional forms plus 10%. If you have less forms, you may not see any increase. Always remember, I only charge for required forms to include the forms that allow you to claim credits reducing your tax burden.

Every year we are reminded how much we value our relationship with you, and we want to say once again thank you for trusting us with your financial and tax work. Please call us with any questions.
